- ☆Walk-in registrations are done in front of the lecture room. Please give the receptionist your name.
- ☆Nature observations are scheduled to end around 12:30. *You may choose to leave midway.
- ☆Those who pre-registered for the nature observations will receive their ticket discount coupon via mail. This coupon can be used from
- ☆Those who are already in Murodo-daira for sightseeing or mountain climbing can also participate. *No fare discount for said individuals (Please make an inquiry to the receptionist on the day of the event. Please note, however, that this is intended for individuals and that group applications are not accepted.)
- ☆Since the event will be held in a high mountainous area, it will be canceled if circumstances such as bad weather deem it unsafe.
- ☆Deadline for registrations is one week before the event, first-come-first-served. Via phone only. (Phone: 076-463-5401, 8:30~17:00, Applications start on March 10. Closed during winter except on Saturdays and Sundays.)
